

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

#### **GENERAL POWER TOOL SAFETY WARNINGS**



Warning: Please read the following instructions carefully, failure to do so could lead to serious personal injury. When using the electric brush cutter and line trimmer, basic safety precautions, including the following, should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and personal injury. Read all these instructions before operating this product and save these instructions. The term "power tool" in the warnings refers to your mainsoperated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

Become familiar with the owner's manual before attempting to operate this machine.

- This machine is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- The machine is only to be used with the power supply unit provided with the machine.

Important! Read carefully before use, keep for further reference.

## **Work Area Safety**

- Keep work area clean and well lit. Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.
- Do not operate power tools in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust. Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.
- Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool. Distractions can cause you to lose control.

## **Electrical Safety**

- Power tool plugs must match the outlet. Never modify the plug in any way. Do not use any adapter plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools. Unmodified plugs and matching outlets will reduce risk of electric shock.
- Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces, such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators. There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed or grounded.

### **Power Tool Use and Care**

## Operation

- This product should not be used for any other purpose than described. Note that national regulations can restrict the use of this product.
- Working with this product is demanding; therefore, ensure you are physically and mentally fit to complete the job safely. Do not use the product when you are tired, ill or under the influence of alcohol or other drugs.
- Pay attention to your posture; always use the provided harness and keep your back straight. Do not overwork yourself. Take regular breaks to ensure concentrated work and full control over the product.
- Keep a firm footing and balance during operation. Always be sure of a safe and secure operating position, whilst using the product. Never use the product standing on steps or a ladder.

  - Cleaning or when clearing a blockage.
  - Checking, carrying out maintenance or working on the product.
  - Adjusting the working position of the cutting device.
  - Leaving the product unattended.
- Ensure that the product is correctly located in a designated working position before switch on the motor.
- While operating the product, always ensure that the operating position is safe and secure.
- Do not operate the product with a damaged or excessively worn cutting blades chain or edges.
- Always ensure that all handles and guards are fitted when using the product. Never attempt to use an incomplete product or one fitted with an unauthorised modification.
- Always use two hands to operate a product fitted with two handles.
- Always be aware of your surroundings and stay alert for possible hazards of which you may be aware due to the noise of the product.
- Always ensure that ventilation openings are kept clear of debris.

## Maintenance and storage

- Improper maintenance and removal of safety devices leads to hazards causing injuries and damage to property.
- When the product is stopped for servicing, inspection or storage, shut off the power source, remove from the mains and make sure all moving parts have come to a stop. Allow the product to cool before making any inspections, adjustments, etc.
- Always allow the product to cool down before storing.

- Use only manufacturers recommended replacement parts and accessories.

# Product Safety Warnings Brush Cutter and Line Trimmer Safety Warnings:

- Use the tool only with specifically designated AC power supplies. Use of any other AC power supplies will increase the risk of injury and fire.
- Only operate the product in daylight or in good artificial light.
- Wear protection, where there is a risk of falling objects.
- Wear eye protection (goggles or face shield).

- Wear ear protection.
- Wear foot protection and gloves (on brush cutters).

To reduce the impact of noise and vibration emission, limit the time of operation, use low-vibration and low- noise operating modes and wear personal protective equipment.

- 1. Only use the product as intended by its design and these instructions.
- 2. Ensure that the product is in good condition and well maintained.
- 3. Use correct application tools for the product and ensure they in good condition.

- 5. Maintain this product in accordance with these instructions and keep it well lubricated (where appropriate).
- 6. Plan your work schedule to spread any high vibration tool use across a longer period of time.


## **Residual Risks:**

Even with the intended use of the appliance there is always a residual risk, which can not be prevented. According to the type and construction of the appliance the following potential hazards might apply:

- Access to the rotating saw chain (cutting hazards)
- Unforeseen, abrupt movement of the guide bar (cutting hazards)

#### **ASSEMBLY AND OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS**



NOTE: To reduce the risk of injury, user must read instruction manual.

#### Intended Use

This 2 in 1 brush cutter and line trimmer is designated with an electrical machinery. Depending on the attached accessory this product is intended to be used as:

- 1). Brush cutter: With the cutter blade attached the product is intended to cut heavier weeds, brush and similar vegetation.
- Line trimmer: With the line spool attached the product is intended to cut smaller types of weed, lawn grass or similar soft vegetation. It must not be used to work on unusually thick, dry or wet grass, e.g. pasture grass, or to shred leaves.
- 3). The product must not be used for cutting other materials, such as plastic, stone, metal or wood that contains foreign objects and must not be used outside of domestic premises.
- 4). Observe the technical data for the maximum cutting capacity according to the application (see "Technical data".
- 5). This product is intended for private domestic use only, not for any commercial trade use. It must not be used for any purposes other than those described.

#### **ASSEMBLY**

#### Unpacking

This device must be installed first.

- Carefully remove the unit and all accessories out of the box and check everything for completeness.
- 2. Check the unit carefully to ensure that no damage during transport occurred.
- 3. Do not dispose the packaging material before the unit is carefully inspected and trial-used.



#### WARNING:

If anything is missing, please do not use the device until the missing parts are replaced. Otherwise it may lead to serious injuries.



#### WARNING:

Do not attempt to modify the product or use an accessory that is not recommended by the manufacturer for use with this device. Such modifications shall be deemed as abuse and can lead to dangerous situations and severe injuries.



#### WARNING:

You should never remove, mount or adjust the accessories while the machine is still running. If you do not turn off the engine in advance, serious injuries may occur.

#### Assemble the lower shaft (Brush cutter/Grass trimmer shaft)


Remove the black cap on the lower shaft. Rotate the wing nut and release the wing nut from the shaft connector.

Insert the lower shaft into the connector, make sure the stop pin (a) on the shaft slots into the hole (b). If the shaft is not able to be fully inserted, slightly rotate the lower shaft or spindle to ensure full alignment before insertion. Once fully inserted, the limit pin will lock into the limit hole with a "click" sound.

Fasten the wing nut on the connector after the shaft is fully inserted.



**WARNING!** Always make sure the tubes cannot be be twisted once connected, the internal shaft should be free to move. Check there is no loose connection. Loose connection increases vibration and results in machaine damage and personal injuries.






#### WARNING:

Make sure that the wing nut knob is firmly secured before operating the unit. Please double check regularly.

#### Fitting of the auxiliary handle

The auxiliary handle should be used for maximum control and safety in the operation of the device.


1. Loosen the auxiliary handle into 3 parts; Auxiliary handle, lower plate and screws.




2. Install the auxiliary handle onto shaft.

Warning: According to the safety regulation, user should be on the same side of stop lever when

operating




3. Tighten the screw. There is a groove on the shaft, and the lower plate should align with the groove on the shaft during installation. You can adjust the position of the auxiliary handle in order to achieve the best balance and comfort.




#### Installation of the blade guard

1. Loosen the allen bolts form the safety guard using the provided hex key.



2. Mount the safety guard onto the shaft working head and fix the safety guard with 2 allen bolts and tighten the bolts seurely.




#### Installation of the brush cutter blade

Insert a hex key into the shaft lock hole (located on the side of the working head) to secure the shaft. After unscrewing the safety nut, remove the safety nut, flange cover and locking flange in sequence from the shaft working head.

Mount the brush cutter blade onto the backing flange (the centre hole of the main blade must be fully aligned with the centre protrusion of the backing flange and remain stable without shifting). Then, install the locking flange, flange cover, and safety nut in sequence. With the hex key inserted into the shaft lock hole to secure the shaft, use an open-end wrench to tighten the safety nut, firmly securing the blade onto the shaft. After tightening, remove the hex key.

To remove the blade, reverse the above steps. Be sure to wear protective gloves when installing and removing the blade.




#### Installation of the line spool for grass trimmer.

Insert a hex key into the shaft lock hole (located on the side of the working head) to secure the shaft. After unscrewing the safety nut, remove the safety nut, flange cover, locking flange, and backing flange in sequence.

Tighten the line spool with the grass-cutting line onto the shaft by rotating it counterclockwise. After installation, remove the hex key.

To remove the line spool, reverse the above steps. Be sure to wear protective gloves when installing and removing the line spool.



#### Change the nylon line


- 1. Pull out the remaining grass-cutting line: Below the red arrow on the front of the bottom of the line spool, there is a threading hole for the grass-cutting line on each side (as shown in Figure 1). Firmly press on the surface with the red arrow while pulling the grass-cutting line out from the line exit holes on both sides of the line spool if the line can no longer extend automatically. (Fig.1)
- 2. Thread new grass-cutting line into the line spool:

Recommend nylon grass trimming line diameter 1.6-2.0mm x 5m.

Press firmly on the surface with the red arrow, then insert both ends of the new grass-cutting line into the threading holes below the red arrow. Stop when approximately 10 cm of line extends from the line exit holes on both sides of the spool. Pull the line firmly from both exit holes to ensure that it fits closely within the line grooves inside the spool. (Fig 2 and Fig 3)

3. Wind the threaded grass-cutting line into the line spool: Press firmly on the surface with the red arrow, and rotate the top cover of the line spool counterclockwise. Repeat this action until all of the grass-cutting line is wound into the line spool. Ensure that the groove between the two red arrows is fully aligned with the grass-cutting line. Release the surface with the red arrow to complete the loading of the line. (Fig.4)

#### **OPERATION INSTRUCTIONS**

#### 1. Safety shoulder belt

The safety should belt helps the operator carry this product.



WARNING! Always attach the product to the shoulder strap. Do not carry it just by hand.

- 1). To remove the shoulder strap from the loop, open the securing clip.
- 2). Place the shoulder strap so that it runs over the left shoulder, crossing the chest and back. The securing clip must be located at the right hip.




Adjust the length of the harness so that the hook is approximately 15 cm below your waist; locate the product to the harness by using the securing clip ensuring that the angle of the cutting head is parallel to the surface being cut.



**WARNING!** Always attach the product to the shoulder strap. Do not carry it only with your hands.

4). In case of emergency, pull the rope of the quick release mechanism. The metal locking bar will be released from the securing clip automatically because of the weight of the machine, and the machine will drop away from you.



#### 2. Brush cutter




**WARNING!** To avoid hazards never cut heavier weeds, bush and similar vegetation with a thickness of over 20mm. Avoid contact with stones, wire, glass etc. that may cause injury to the user. Inspect the blade regularly for damage, cracks or breaks. Always replace a damaged blade.



**WARNING!** When working with the cutter blade there is always a risk of kickback if the cutting head comes into contact with a hard object. Kickback will cause the sudden stalling of the cutting head, which in turn results in the cutting head being forced in the opposite direction to the rotation of the cutter blade. Ensure that you retain a firm grip with both hands at any sign of such kickback, pay attention and retain a firm stance to avoid injuries.

- 1). Use the cutter blade to cut heavier weeds, bush and similar vegetation with a thickness of up to 20mm.
- 2). Hold the product firmly so that it sits with a gap between the product and your right side.
- 3). Stand upright, do not lean forward and pay attention to posture. Keep both feet apart to help retain your balance.
- 4). Never hold the cutting head higher than your hip; the higher you hold the cutting head will increase the risk of objects being thrown.




- 5). Carefully plunge the blade from above when cutting long undergrowth.
- 6). Move the cutting head towards the base of young trees or thicker vegetation.


#### 3. Grass trimmer

- 1). Use the trimmer head to cut smaller types of weed, lawn grass or similar soft vegetation.
- 2). Remove the protection cap from the line cutter on the safety guard.
- 3). Hold the product firmly so that it sits with a gap between the product and your right side.
- 4). Stand upright, do not lean forward and pay attention to posture. Keep both feet apart to help retain your balance.


5). Hold the trimmer head just above the ground at an angle of approximately 30°.




6). Move the product with slow and regular arc from left to right before moving it back to the starting position before trimming the next area.



- 7). Ensure the cutting head remains clean and free from off-cuts that may cause it to jam. Check regularly, Disconnect the machine from mains and wait until it stops completely before checking.
- 8). Trim longer grass in stages, do not cut long grass in one cut. For the best results, cut longer grass in steps.







9). A line cutter (B9) is integrated with the trimming guard (B8) and this will cut the line to the necessary length.



**WARNING!** The cut line will be thrown out. Danger of injury especially for bystanders.



- 10). For best results, do not cut wet grass as it may stick to the cutting heads and guard, preventing proper discharge of grass trimmings, and could cause you to slip and fall.
- 11). Pay special attention when performing the work close to trees and bushes. The cutting heads could damage sensitive bark, and damage fence posts.



## **CARE AND CLEANING**

#### **MAINTENANCE**



#### WARNING:

Use only original spare parts. The use of other parts presents a danger and could lead to accidents or injuries.



#### WARNING:

Always wear safety glasses with side shields when using the device. In dusty environments, you should also wear a dust mask.



#### WARNING:

Before you check, clean the device or perform maintenance, you must wait until the motor stops and all moving parts have come to a halt. Then disconnect the power connection and move the device to a different place. Failure to follow these instructions may result in serious injury or damage to property.

#### **GENERAL MAINTENANCE**

After each use, clean the unit.

Avoid the use of commercial solvents, the unit may be damaged. Use clean cloth to remove dirt, dust, oil or grease.



#### **WARNING:**

Never spill brake fluid, petroleum-based fluids, penetrating oil, etc. on the plastic parts. These can damage the plastic, which could lead to serious injury.


